## **RULES FOR THE TERRY MARDELL MEMORIAL YEAR END AWARDS:**

All Riders must follow the General rules for Year-End Awards.

The Terry Mardell Memorial Award is given to recognize the biggest improvement in scores for a horse and rider pair at a given level. The lesser score must be earned first and for the lowest test of a given level. The greater score must be earned later and for the highest test of the same level.

Both scores must be earned in TREA virtual shows, TREA sanctioned schooling shows, or USEF/USDF recognized shows. Both score do not need to be from the same type of show, a combination of show types is acceptable.

Submit one Enrollment Form and \$25 enrollment fee per horse and rider combo, per award division.

Please include a copy of the dressage tests (total points and percentage must be visible) with judge's signature or a USDF computerized score sheet.

You must be a TREA member in good standing at the time the scores were earned.

Enrollment forms are due and must be postmarked or emailed by December 1<sup>st</sup> of each award year.

Three awards will be given, one each for Open, Amateur, and Junior riders.

Each award will be given to the horse and rider with the largest improvement in scores, calculated by subtracting the lesser score from the greater score.
